

Look forward with faith

In Mark 11:22–24, Jesus encourages His disciples to 'have faith in God' and goes on to make this extraordinary claim that, if we do, we can move mountains. Most commentators are pretty sure it's a figurative expression and He's not talking about causing literal ecological and geographical havoc to the world map. And yet, the force of His logic is inescapable: things that look unmoveable, problems that look vast and way beyond us; all of these things can shift simply by believing prayer. He goes on to explain what believing prayer looks like. 'Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.'

That makes me think of a story I came across in a book by Rick Warren.

A boy named James was not a believer and, in fact, was quite anti-Christian. One day, his mother bought him a Bible, laid it on his desk, and said, 'Here, son, is your new Bible.'

James asked, 'What is this for?'

His mother answered, 'You don't know it yet but you're about to become a Christian.'

James responded, 'No, I'm not! I'm going to play football and go to hell.'

His mother stood up in church that night and said, 'My son is about to become a Christian. He doesn't know it yet, but I'm thanking God in advance,'

So, James' friends began to walk up to him on the street and say, 'I heard you became a Christian.' 'No, it's just my crazy mother! I'm going to play football and go to hell.'

But his mother told her pastor, 'I want you to save twenty minutes on Saturday night for my son to give his testimony.'

On the Friday night before that Saturday, James was playing football when he suddenly felt God's presence right on the playing field. He got down on his knees and prayed in front of everybody, 'God, I really need you in my life. If you can make a difference, come in and change me. Save me, whatever it takes. Make me born again.'

James ran off the field in his football kit, down the street and up the stairs into his house. He hugged his mother and proclaimed 'Mum, I just became a Christian!'

She replied, 'Of course. I've been telling you for three weeks!'

That's the power of faith.

At the start of 2023, I just want to very simply encourage us all to face the year with faith. Let's agree not to be intimidated by the mountains. Let's believe God for great things. We have our very own faith story of God giving us a site way beyond what we asked or imagined. Clearly, He has big plans. God is enough. He will come through for us. We don't need to earn His blessing by making a ton of resolutions. We just need to ask and believe.

Have faith in God.

Charles Spurgeon, the 19th-century English preacher, was known as the "Prince of Preachers." It is not an exaggeration to say that thousands came to Christ through His preaching. A group of young ministers came one day to visit his church. After showing them the massive sanctuary, Spurgeon offered to show them his "boiler room." The guests were not interested because boiler rooms were not pleasant places to visit. They were hot and dirty; usually located down in the basement. In Spurgeon's time, steam was the power source of the day; boiler rooms were the powerhouses, the driving forces of everything. Spurgeon led the young ministers down to the basement where they found about one hundred people in prayer. "This," Spurgeon said with a smile, "is my boiler room." Whenever Spurgeon was asked the secret of his ministry he always replied, "My people pray for me."

Inspired by this story we are holding monthly prayer meetings at the new site on Sunday evenings. It's an opportunity to put into practise what we'll have been learning in the Prayers of Many course.



PRAYERS OF MANY COURSE

Our Community Groups are going to work through the Prayers of Many course this term.

It's nine sessions to help you engage with corporate prayer in a fresh way. When teaching his followers to pray, Jesus teaches them this prayer: "Our Father, hallowed be your name, Your Kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

They are familiar words, but how would the world change if today's followers came together regularly to pray them? Imagine the transformations that would happen in our families, our communities and our nations! Yet a lot of us have found prayer meetings that feel monotonous and seem more like a duty than an exciting time of world-changing prayer.

Our corporate prayer culture desperately needs a revolution.

Worship in the Western church was once in a similarly poor state, but over recent decades it has been utterly transformed. Imagine what would happen if we applied the same time, creative energy and budget on revolutionising corporate prayer?

Are you ready to get serious about corporate prayer?

If we truly believe that only God can heal our broken nations, now is the time to discover new ways to engage with corporate prayer. The Prayers of Many Course has been designed to help small groups reengage with corporate prayer anew, inviting them afresh to the glorious privilege of praying together.

It is time to relearn how to pray together to see our Father glorified, His kingdom come to earth, and our nations transformed.

- In April we received planning approval for change of use and completed the purchase.

All these milestones brought new connections and renewed favour. God has been good.

As we start 2023, we have much to be thankful for and we enter into a season of prayer for God to continue to show Himself faithful.


