A Loving Church

Wouldn't it be amazing if our Church was famous for our love?

Love is the priority. Paul said love is 'the most excellent way' (1 Cor 12:31) and 'the greatest' (v13). Peter said, 'Above all else, love one another' (1 Peter 4:8). John's most frequent command was 'love one another' (1 John 4:7). Jesus said the greatest commandment was loving God and loving our neighbour (Mark 12:30–31).

There are often misunderstandings about love so it's important to ground ourselves in the biblical definition. Some people think mainly in sentimental and romantic terms and a common myth is that love would 'never make anyone unhappy'. But Jesus was perfect love, and he once looked at a rich young ruler 'and loved him' yet after their conversation that man 'went away sad' (Matt 19:16-22). Perfect love doesn't bend truth to make people happy. It 'rejoices with the truth'.

That last statement is one phrase from Paul's four-sentence definition of love, a stunning passage often read at weddings – 1 Cor 13:4–7.

The passage contains three big ideas:

1. Love is 'rejoicing with' instead of 'comparing against'.

Paul contrasts love with envy, boasting, pride, self-seeking, and dishonouring others. Love is the opposite of comparison.

Romans 12:15, another passage about love, states it more positively: 'Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn.'

Love is being happy for others, rejoicing in their giftedness and success. Love is also being sad with others – sharing in their suffering and grieving with them.

Love is rejoicing with instead of comparing against.

2. Love is seeing the best in others.

Paul says love 'keeps no record of wrongs' and that it 'rejoices with the truth'. Love is focused on what is good and true. He also says love 'always protects, always trusts and always hopes'. Because God doesn't need protecting, we know he's talking here about how we treat others. He's encouraging us to refuse cynicism and believe the best of others.

Image two pairs of glasses -

- One highlights and magnifies people failures and character flaws,
- One highlights and magnifies the good things people do, where they get it right.

Love is like taking off the first pair and wearing the second pair of glasses. Love sees and draws attention to what someone is getting right.

So the irony is, it's not very loving to complain that other people aren't very loving. Love keeps no record of wrongs and rejoices with the truth.

3. Love is swapping 'I am first' for 'I am second.'

Central to the biblical definition of love is this idea of self-giving – putting God and others first. Paul says simply 'love is not self-seeking'.

What is the opposite of being self-seeking? 1 John 3:16 presents this idea more positively 'This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters.'

Love is laying down your own life and putting God and the lives of others first.

The Bible is not saying your life is not precious, but that your precious and valuable life should be laid down for others because they are precious too.

Loving is costly. Even this amazing passage about love was written to a Church who ended up treating Paul really badly.

To love at all is to be vulnerable. Love anything and your heart will be wrung and possibly broken. If you want to make sure of keeping it intact you must give it to no one, not even an animal. Wrap it carefully round with hobbies and little luxuries; avoid all entanglements. Lock it up safe in the casket or coffin of your selfishness. But in that casket, safe, dark, motionless, airless, it will change. It will not be broken; it will become unbreakable, impenetrable, irredeemable. To love is to be vulnerable.

GIFT DAYS - 26TH FEBRUARY AND 5TH MARCH

We continue to believe God for abundant provision as we step forward as a Church.

God has been amazingly good to us. We have raised and spent £514,000 on our Church building project to date.

What are we giving towards over these two dates?

There are three parts - maintaining the ground we've taken, taking more ground, and being generous.

- 1. Maintaining the ground we've taken we've taken some big faith steps in the past year. We've increased our staff team Andy Severn and Elia Stroudinsky have joined the CCC staff team strengthening our children's work, fundraising and administration. We've also bought this amazing site which incurs significant regular costs. So we want to raise funds to help us maintain the ground we've taken.
- **2. We also want to take more ground** we want to take some big steps forward with our building project. You can see the detail of our plans on the wall at the side of our church hall. We want to raise £252,500. This would enable us to complete some compliance aspects of the site in respect of safety things like entrance resurfacing, electrical works, roof repairs, CCTV for security etc. But it would also enable us to further develop Units 2 and 3 so we have room to grow, host large events, and move activities over from the Lighthouse. We also want to replace the flat roof at the front of the building and install solar panels so that we can reduce our energy bills and be ready to develop the Youth Centre.

Initially we thought we would do the bare minimum at this part of the building, in a temporary way and concentrate more quickly on the front of the building, but a few things have been provoking us:

- We've been encouraged prophetically that we need more facilities than we originally planned. Here's one word we were given by someone outside of our church: 'Prepare for at least twice as much as you planned for. You need to reconsider what you have been planning for. I think it's got to be at least double. Ministrywise at least double. Facilities-wise at least double what you've been planning for. And that will, like lifting the sword, seem almost impossible: 'How could we possibly do that?' God says, 'You believe it, I'll deliver it'.
- With Benny stepping in to lead our social action work, we also anticipate needing more space for our projects. We don't know exactly how, but we can sense a surge of growth coming here.

So we don't expect what we develop at this end of the building to be temporary, even though we don't fully know what it will be used for once the front of the building is developed.

3. Be generous – we want to support the church plant being started in the Netherlands who have gathered an amazing team and have a huge vision to plant churches in the nation. You can find out more about them here: https://www.plantnijmegen.com/


RELATIONAL MISSION - LISTENING EAR CONFERENCE

BOILER ROOM - MONTHLY PRAYER MEETING

Charles Spurgeon, the 19th-century English preacher, was known as the "Prince of Preachers." It is not an exaggeration to say that thousands came to Christ through his preaching. A group of young ministers came one day to visit his church. After showing them the massive sanctuary, Spurgeon offered to show them his "boiler room." The guests were not interested because boiler rooms were not pleasant places to visit. They were hot and dirty; usually located down in the basement. In Spurgeon's time, steam was the power source of the day; boiler rooms were the powerhouses, the driving forces of everything. Spurgeon led the young ministers down to the basement where they found about one hundred people in prayer. "This," Spurgeon said with a smile, "is my boiler room." Whenever Spurgeon was asked the secret of his ministry he always replied, "My people pray for me."

Inspired by this story, we are holding monthly prayer meetings at the new site on Sunday evenings. It's an opportunity to put into practice what we'll have been learning in the Prayers of Many course.


